



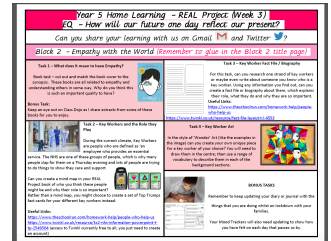
## Home Learning – The Second Block – Week 3 and Week 4

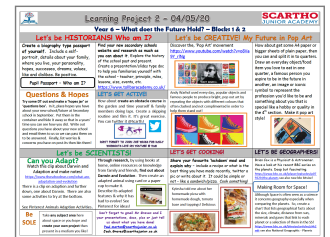

For those in Y3/4/6, we are following on from the success of Y5's REAL Project and introducing our own versions of these in Y3/4/6. These will be explained in more detail in the email you will receive from your child's class teacher. The Y3/4 'Somewhere over the Rainbow' project reflects some of the key aspects covered in the Upper School Projects 'How will our future one day reflect our past?' and 'What does the future hold?'. Our hope is that when we return to school, we will be able to share all the amazing home learning in a huge whole school 'Celebration of Learning' or 'Public Exhibition'.

For those of you that wanted more specific online support, don't forget that every child has been signed up to Maths Whizz, which is an online tool that assesses where your child is working in maths and then gives them tailor made lessons.
